#### St Bridget's Sunday School (Growing Disciples)

As with many groups during the COVID pandemic our Growing Disciples group have not been able to meet. Recently the volunteers who lead our children each week, have been looking at safe ways of restarting to gather them together again after the school holidays.

At the moment they are exploring exciting and innovative ways of meeting with God in the open air. As part of this review a group re-branding is being considered as a way to reflect the changes under consideration.

Prior to the COVID outbreak, our Church offered a weekly afternoon baby club. This was a time very much appreciated by mothers of pre-school children.

As with all our groups, they have not been able to join together for the past 18 months. Added to the restrictions imposed by COVID, we have also got issues with the room heating. So unfortunately, we apologise that, it will be a while yet before we are able to re-start this group.

#### St Bridget's Youth Cafe

The youth of our community are the future of the Church and the country. We have a small Youth Cafe which, prior to COVID, met monthly on a Saturday night. A lively group of young people gathered together to chat, play computer games, board games and consume copious amounts of hot chocolate, cakes and sweets.

We hope to re-open our Youth Cafe in October once all necessary risk assessments are complete. The group will be open to children in school years 6 and above.
